14th Nippon Connection Film Festival – The Complete Program

Japanese Summer in Frankfurt with more than 130 films and over 50 cultural events

The program of the 14th Japanese Film Festival Nippon Connection in Frankfurt am Main is now complete. From May 27 to June 1 the world's largest festival of Japanese cinema will show more than 100 feature and short films, many of which will be German, European or international premieres. The selection ranges from arthouse cinema masterpieces, exciting thrillers, and crazy comedies to touching dramas, and documentaries on topical issues. More than 50 Japanese film makers, actors and artists will mingle with the audience at the festival center in Künstlerhaus Mousonturm and the adjacent Willy Praml Theater in der Naxoshalle. Other venues are located at the German Filmmuseum, Mal Seh'n Cinema and the exhibiton space ausstellungsraum Eulengasse. A varied cultural program with lectures, exhibitions, concerts, culinary delights and workshops for all ages offers a fascinating experience of all things Japanese.

The Films

With 400 new films each year, Japan is the fourth biggest film producing nation in the world. Based on a careful selection, Nippon Connection showcases a diverse and multifaceted line-up. The **Nippon Cinema** section will include the new drama **Like Father, Like Son** by director Hirokazu Koreeda, celebrated in Cannes and Venice, as well as **Backwater**, an arthouse masterpiece of internationally acclaimed film maker Shinji Aoyama. Fans of star actor Ken Watanabe can look forward to **Unforgiven** by Sang-il Lee, a remake of the Clint Eastwood cult western, set in 19th century Japan.

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Plenty of hilarity is guaranteed in the often bizarre scenarios in Japanese comedies. In **The Apology King**, Nobuo Mizuta tells the story of an agency issuing tailor-made excuses, possibly a business model only Japan can come up with. In his long awaited new film, **Why Don't You Play in Hell?**, provocative star director Sion Sono sends a gang of Yakuza on a series of misadventures in the film business.

Many favorite guests will once again return to present their latest works at the festival. Ryuichi Hiroki will come personally to present his moving romantic drama **Crying 100 Times – Every Raindrop Falls**. And Nobuhiro Yamashita's new work **Tamako in Moratorium** is about discontent, unhappy young Tamako finally finding her own way in life.

Cult director Takashi Miike will delight horror fans with **Lessons of Evil**. The first Japanese-Indonesian co-produced thriller **Killers** by the Mo Brothers is all about murder in the age of social media and the world wide web. Likewise, in Yoshiro Nakamura's suspense-packed crime drama **The Snow White Murder Case**, everyone is talking about it on Twitter, while an ambitious journalist tries to solve the murder.

Fans of Japanese animation films will enjoy the second edition of the **Nippon Animation** section. Highlights include **Patema Inverted** by Yasuhiro Yoshiura, a journey into a fantastical world where everything is upside-down. Director Katsuhiro Otomo, creator of the legendary manga and anime Akira, returns this year with **Short Peace**. Besides Otomo, the list of directors in this short film compilation includes Oscar-nominated animation artist Shuhei Morita.

The section **Nippon Visions** is a forum for young directors, independent film creators and films that exceed the ordinary. Reflecting new trends and providing a platform for young talents, this section is much appreciated by international professional visitors. Several directors and artists will be presenting their works personally and answer the audience's questions. This year's highlights include Tetsuichiro Tsuta's poetic epos **The Tale of Iya** and the timeless melodrama **A Woman and War** by Junichi Inoue.

Three years after the disastrous earthquake in Japan, the impact on the country and its citizens is still large. The documentaries **The Horses of Fukushima** by Yoju Matsubayashi and **Kesennuma**, **Voices**. **3** by Yukihiko Tsutsumi tell the story of people (and animals) in the regions affected most by the tsunami and nuclear accident. **The Connecting Bridge** by the deaf-mute director Ayako Imamura narrates how deaf people experienced the catastrophe and the time following it.

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Hiroshi Kanno's drama **Fukushima** shows how the nuclear power plant has been inflicting the region for more than 70 years.

This year's retrospective **Nippon Retro** is dedicated to **Ko Nakahira: The Wild Child of the Sixties**. The Japanese director Nakahira (1926-1978) started his career as assistant of legends such as Akira Kurosawa and Kaneto Shindo. In 1956 he directed the scandalous success **Crazed Fruit** and thus became a pioneer for the Japanese New Wave. In this and eight more films from the 1950s and 1960s the audience is invited to delve deep into the rebellious era of Japan's postwar generation.

The Competitions

For the first time, there will be four prizes. The **Nippon Cinema Award** celebrates its tenth edition this year. It will be assigned to the best film of the section Nippon Cinema by the audience. The prize money of 2,000 Euros is donated by Bankhaus Metzler from Frankfurt. The most convincing work from the section Nippon Visions receives the **Nippon Visions Jury Award**, awarded by an international jury. Here the prize is the subtitling of the director's next film, sponsored by the Japanese Visualmedia Translation Academy in Tokyo. In addition, for the first time the audience can choose their favorite Nippon Visions film. The winner of the **Nippon Visions Audience Award**, sponsored by the Japanisches Kulturzentrum in Frankfurt, will receive 1,000 Euros. The best 12-seconds-extra-shortfilm on the topic "Nippon in Motion" will be awarded the **VGF Nippon in Motion Award** and given 250 Euros, sponsored by the VerkehrsGesellschaft Frankfurt am Main. All visitors of the festival website are invited to vote for their favorite Nippon in Motion film until April 30, 2014 (www.nipponconnection.com).

Nippon Culture

Nippon Connection is not only an event for film fans. In between watching movies visitors can taste delicious Japanese food and stroll through the market. Numerous workshops, lectures and concerts offer insights into Japanese culture. Enthusiasts of Japanese traditions will find a number of workshops, e.g. on **kimonos**, **taiko drums**, **kobudo** (martial arts from Okinawa), **kyudo** (archery), **kendo** (martial arts with bamboo swords) and **tea ceremony**. Visitors can discover your own talents in **cooking** classes, **subtitling** and **manga drawing** workshops. The photo exhibition **Tokyo 24-70mm** by Natascha Pflaumbaum with city scenes of Tokyo can be visited in the exhibition space ausstellungsraum Eulengasse and provides an insight into

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modern Japan. A special highlight of this year's culture program will be the premiere of a culinary tour through Frankfurt. Koto player and singer **Karin Nakagawa** will give a concert with her Japanese harp (koto). And for those who want to relax, there will be massages and green tea in the Naxoshalle, along with Japanese boardgames. The film program will be accompanied by a panel discussion, talks with film makers, as well as lectures on the situation in Fukushima, director Hirokazu Koreeda and the Japanese cinema of the 1960s.

Nippon Kids

In a special program for young festival visitors, 6- to 12-year-olds can discover Japanese culture in a playful way. There will be workshops about Japanese guardian god Jizo, swordplay (kendo), calligraphy and preparing a delicious lunchbox. A painting workshop with artist Kozue Kodama and a paper theater (kamishibai) performance are other highlights of the Nippon Kids program. In addition, there will be a Japanese children's film with German voice-over.

The Organizers

The Japanese Film Festival Nippon Connection was founded in 2000. It is organized on a voluntary basis by the 50-member team of the nonprofit organization Nippon Connection.
